### ADVENTURE ADD-ON

Join us for the motorboat and jet-ski cruises on Gdansk Bay. From a couple of hours to a whole day on water. Jet-ski and RIB boat cruises give virtually unlimited opportunities to enjoy the extremely varied landscape of Gdansk Bay and Bay of Puck. From the deck of the boat you can admire: the Old Town and port of Gdansk, Sopot pier, Gdynia port, Jastarnia pier, Palace of Rzucewo, Westerplatte, old German Torpedo Launchers, ship wreck yard and scenic landscape of the coastal beaches. We can also arrange a unique attraction – catering in the middle of the Bay of Puck – on Glebinka sand shallow – near a giant ship wreck yard. The actual program and length of the cruise depends on the weather and water conditions.

- **Gdansk Bay** – a bay in the South-Eastern part of the Baltic Sea. The bay is enclosed by the shores of Gdansk Pomerania in Poland Cape Rozewie, and Hel Peninsula and the Kaliningrad Oblast of Russia (Sambian Peninsula). The coast of the bay features two very long sandspits, the Hel peninsula and the Vistula Spit. The first one defines the Bay of Puck, the latter the Vistula Lagoon. Two major polish port of Gdansk and Gdynia are situated by the Bay.
- **Puck Bay** – the lesser sister of Gdansk Bay has very unique character. Sometimes it is called a “Little Sea”. At the deepest point it is 54 meter deep, but with an average depth of 2-6 meters it is generally shallow, what makes it perfect to learn swimming. Everblowing breeze guarantees ideal conditions for all kinds of water sports.
- **Hel Peninsula** – is a 35-km-long sand bar peninsula separating the Bay of Puck from the open Baltic Sea. Being the sunniest place in Poland is at the same time the most windy place in the country. The width of the peninsula varies from some 300 meters in Jurata, through 100 m in the most narrow point to some 3 kilometers at the tip, where the small town of Hel is situated. A landmark of Hel is the octagonal lighthouse – a brick building of 41,5 m height and 197 steep steps leading to the top. During WWII Hel was a site of violent fights – the peninsula is still dotted with remnants of bunkers and fortifications.
